#### **Innovative Teaching Grants**

Thanks to generous donations, the CBC Foundation awards up to \$4,500 each semester to recognize innovative and creative instructional programs or projects that encourage higher levels of student learning.

The Foundation awarded a Spring 2017 Innovative Teaching Grant to Mr. Taylor Tomlin for the NASA Micro-G NExT Challenge.

The grant allowed the team of students named "The Space Cougars" to develop an anchor prototype that was tested in the NASA neutral buoyancy labs as a part of the challenge.

#### **Scholarships Awarded**

Because of our donors' generosity, the CBC Foundation awarded \$22,000 in scholarships to CBC students for the spring 2017 semester and an additional \$29,000 for the summer and fall semesters. Scholarships were awarded to students attending the four CBC campuses: Beeville, Alice, Kingsville, and Pleasanton.

#### **Foundation Scholar**

"CBC Foundation Scholarship Recipient Shoots for the Moon, or Perhaps Mars!"

Regan Wilbanks started his educational career in high school as a dual-enrollment student at Longview Global High School. Regan's family relocated to Beeville, Texas where Regan jumped right in as a CBC student, and was a recipient of CBC Foundation scholarships during the spring 2016 and fall 2017 semesters. He became involved in the ReEnegize Grant undergraduate research project where he grew algae in the hopes of using the oil to create bio-fuel. Regan presented his ReEnergize findings at the 2016 EcoExchangeEdu Showcase at Eco Centro in San Antonio. He developed a formula to enhance the algae nutrition supplement, optimizing the growth outcome.

Regan continued working on the algae project but his focus was on the Micro-G NExT Challenge where he was the Space Cougars' team captain. He envisioned himself working for NASA when he was in preschool. Mr. Taylor Tomlin approached the student lab assistant about the challenge. Regan was ecstatic; he wanted to know where he could sign up! He and Tomlin submitted a design proposal for an anchor prototype to NASA and crossed their fingers. In the meantime, Tomlin applied for the Innovative Teaching Grant to help fund the project, pending acceptance from NASA. During winter semester 2017, the two received word their submission was accepted.

The next step was to create a team, "The Space Cougars" which included: Jacob Mendez, Raj Bhakta, Tyler Kerr, and Regan Wilbanks. The team developed the prototype design over the month, and are fired up about the possibility of testing their design in the NASA neutral buoyancy lab. They were invited to take a tour of the facility in February, which was a highlight for the team. Regan and the team worked diligently on the anchor design for NASA, and they hoped their design would be selected for the upcoming Mars Mission.

Regan used most of his free time working on the project. He did take time to apply for the Joe Barnhart CBC Transfer Scholarship, and was selected as one of the four CBC students to receive the prestigious award. Regan graduated in May from CBC with an Associate in Science degree and a Robotics Certificate. He plans to attend New Mexico State University and continue his educational goal pursuit toward becoming an Aerospace Engineer.

Coastal Bend College was a perfect launch pad for Regan's educational career.
